Okaloosa Technical College PRACTICAL NURSING PROGRAM APPLICATION INFORMATION PLEASE READ THIS IN ITS ENTIRETY BEFORE COMPLETING YOUR APPLICATION:

Entering the Practical Program. The Practical Nursing Program is open to all qualified persons 18 years of age and above with a high school diploma or its equivalent. The Florida Board of Nursing and the Florida Department of Education set forth the Practical Nursing program policies.

A. Entrance Requirements.

- 1. You must pass the TEAS test with a composite (overall) score in the 62nd percentile or better, with a 60th percentile or better in math and a 65th percentile or better in reading, 60th percentile or better in science and English/language.
- 2. You must provide proof of completion of high school or its equivalent (after acceptance).
- 3. Any applicant who has been convicted of a felony must submit a Certificate of Restoration of Civil Rights with their application. Further details on this matter are available from our program Director.
- **B.** Placement into the Program. Applicants are placed into the Practical Nursing Program when all admission requirements are met and selection committee has made final decisions.

Applicants must:

- 1. Apply and pay registration fee.
- 2. Make an appointment for your required **TEAS test (Test of Essential Academic Skills)**. Information is provided only after an application is submitted. Appointments are made through ATI. You will need a computer that had video available. The *non-refundable* testing fee is paid directly to ATI when testing date is selected on-line. Test score submission will be accepted up until specific deadlines per Spring and Fall semester deadlines.
- 3. **Scheduling**: Because of the number of applications received, you will be <u>allowed to test only</u> <u>once</u> during a testing cycle, unless arrange through the Nursing Program. Preparation materials are available on-line or via resource materials. We suggest that you write down the day, date and time of your test. You may change your test appointment, as long as it is within the testing time frame.
- 4. Test Description: The TEAS is a multiple-choice assessment that measures basic academic preparedness in reading, math, science, English and language usage. The overall test contains 170 questions and has a three hour and 29-minute (209 minute) time limit. Of the 170 total questions, 20 questions are used for internal testing purposes and not scored.
- 5. Test Results. The top scores from the TEAS exam will be eligible for placement in the next class. If selected for the program, the student will take a Basic Skills Test (those with a college degree are exempt) within the first weeks of the program. *If* you are *not selected* to enter the program, you will be required to start the admission process again for the next testing cycle. If you do not pass the Basic Skills Test, you will have an opportunity to remediate and retake the test.
- 6. **Interview:** The applicant will meet with the Director of Nursing or faculty member after a

TEAS score has been received.

7. If a candidate has prior college credit (within 5 years) in required courses and received a C (77%) or better, that student will not be required to retake that course in our program. Having college credit will not guarantee your automatic admission into this program, however. Each qualified candidate will have an equal opportunity for admission into the program.

Note: For those accepted into the Practical Nursing Program, it is your responsibility to have all financial aid applications approved and ready for processing. For information regarding financial assistance, consider the following:

C. Additional Entrance Requirements. Applicants selected for Practical Nursing Program will be required to:

- 1. Attend orientation. The date and time will be determined.
- 2. Complete a physical examination. The necessary forms will be issued at the orientation or with the acceptance email.
- 3. Submit to a background check, fingerprint and urine drug screening. Further information will be given after admission to program.
- 4. Update Immunizations
 - Tetanus: must be current within past 7 years
 - Measles
 - Mumps
 - Rubella
 - Influenza shot (during Flu season Oct March)
 - Varicella vaccine or date of chickenpox disease
 - Hepatitis B
 - TB Skin test

General Practical Nursing Program Information: The Practical Nursing Program is a 14-month 1350-hour course of study leading to licensure as a Practical Nurse in the state of Florida. It consists of classes at the Okaloosa Technical College campus and clinical practice in local health care facilities. All instructors are registered nurses and certified vocational technical teachers.

Attendance Policy: OTC School of Practical Nursing has a NO ABSENCE policy. Due to the limited number of hours available for instructional purposes, all absences must be made up within the semester time is missed. Excessive absences will jeopardize the student's progress in the program and may be grounds for dismissal. When a student accumulates a total of 22.5 hours of absences in any one semester, he/she may be dropped from the program.
